

Throughout 2022, we celebrated 125 years of providing useful information, unmatched advocacy for businesses, and money-saving services.

We hosted an elegant reception at Custer State Park in June and a huge bash at the Washington Pavilion in Sioux Falls in September, with more than 300 people in attendance.

We enjoyed participating in and sponsoring a variety of events, from Boss Cowman in Lemmon to Czech Days in Tabor, the Chislic Festival in Freeman, Gold Discovery Days in Custer, the Lake Area Band Festival in Chester, and many others.

We reached record membership, climbing above 4,000 members for the second time in our history. More than 500 new businesses became members and 90 percent of our members remain with the Association beyond their first year.



And we maintained our robust media presence, enjoyed a successful legislative session where we tracked upwards of 200 bills, expanded our ProStart culinary training program to 21 high schools, provided ServeSafe food service training to more than 1,000 people, and printed nearly 6,000 copies of our comprehensive Legislative Lineup.

To celebrate our quasquicentennial anniversary, we hosted a celebratory social event at the Washington Pavilion's Mary Sommervold stage in Downtown Sioux Falls. At the September 19 event, over 300 guests enjoyed delicious appetizers, Vesselager 125 (a beer made by Dempsey's in Watertown, named after Retailers Association founding member Governor R.S. Vessey), desserts from Oh My Cupcakes! and One Smart Cookie, and live entertainment from Goodroad, voted the #1 local band in Sioux Falls nine times!

Available for guests to enjoy was a photo booth and a plethora of free 'swag' items, including oversized mink-touch blankets, keychains, stickers, beer mugs, lowball glasses, ice scrapers, and more. The party favors were a favorite among the crowd, quickly clearing off shelves.

Combining the themes of retail and our historic past, the venue was decorated as a downtown. There was a diner, studio, bakery, mercantile, beer cart, retail store, post office, Montgomery's Furniture store, and extra decorations, like light posts and an animated backdrop with twinkling stars and lights of Winner's downtown in the 1940's. Some booths were named after prominent staff members in our history, including past Executive Director Jerry Wheeler and Carol Nowak, the longest-serving employee in SD Retailers history.

ANNUAL MEETING | JANUARY 10, 2022 BUSINESS FORUMS HIGHLIGHT HOT TOPICS



ADVOCATING FOR YOU!

SUCCESSFUL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Our legislative team is there every step of the way, advocating for laws that make it easier for you to run your business and defending you from burdensome red tape. In 2022, we tracked 189 bills and joint resolutions – or 34% of all legislation introduced.

Most notably, we successfully supported passage of legislation to amend alcohol licensing laws to better reflect population changes in the state, helped defeat several proposals that sought to limit the right of employers to establish employee policies, and successfully opposed legislation to create new county taxes.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES SDRA ADVOCATE

2022 was our third year of a fully digital Legislative Bulletin. Each week the most current legislative session information was delivered straight to your inbox, including bills we're tracking and important updates that could affect your business. A member-only section of the website included bill summaries that were updated as the bill progressed or was killed. We also provided a weekly recap video highlighting the top topics of the week, which are also available anytime at *sdra.org*.

A SEAT AT THE TABLE

SDRA gives your business a seat at the table when lawmakers consider new taxes, expanded regulations, and policy changes that impact your business. We monitor meetings of state boards and commissions, enact policy changes during rules hearings, and serve on task forces and work groups that discuss topics important to business. For example, this year we were instrumental in killing proposals that sought to carve out property tax breaks for certain groups of taxpayers.

FINANCIAL YEAR IN REVIEW

OUR RESERVE FUND MAINTAINS A HEALTHY BALANCE

Officially established by the Board in the mid-1990s, the fund protects SDRA against unforeseen expenses or unexpected loss of revenue.

The reserve funds are invested and managed by our Finance Officer and Investment Committee. Use of the money requires approval from two-thirds of the full Board of Directors.

RELIABLE RENTAL INCOME

Rental income from seven tenants (five trade associations, a law firm, and a psychologist) cover the cost of property taxes and maintenance. The South Dakota Retailers Association constructed the building across from the Capitol in 1992 and was able to pay off the loan a year later.

This year, we added a new sign to the front of the building!

Offered through Optilegra Vision Plans of Sioux Falls, this popular employee benefit is accepted by 98% of South Dakota's vision centers. Group rates for 1 to 50 employees, and individual ratings for large groups with more than 50 enrollees.

Businesses are saving with our Health Plan

We offer health care coverage options through Hahn Financial Group, Inc. Groups as small as two employees can participate in a self-funding plan, using a third party administrator and referenced-based pricing with stop loss coverage.

Members utilized our **Employment Law Service** in the first 11 months of 2022

Our members can contact the Jackson Lewis law firm at no cost to get answers to basic employment law questions, thanks to our retainer agreement. This member benefit has a value of \$565 an hour!

Members can receive answers on issues such as: minimum wage, overtime, tip credit, employee discipline and termination, harassment, vacation and sick leave, FMLA and ADA issues, unemployment benefits, workers' compensation, marijuana use on the job, and other issues.

Members receive Shipping Discounts

In the last year, members saved more than \$14,000 using the services of PartnerShip LLC, an independent freight broker that manages shipping programs for associations. Small and large businesses are eligible for discounts when utilizing the services of FedEx, UPS Freight and YRC Freight.

This fall, we introduced social media marketing services through Black Hills Social Media Management. Members receive discounted, fully customized social media management to grow an audience with minimal effort.

Members are protected with Data Security

Every business needs protection from computer viruses, spyware, data theft and other threats. SDRA offers protection through Infotech Solutions, LLC of Madison. They will perform a free analysis of your current system and offer real-time monitoring and detection of threats to your network security as well as multi-level protection against outside threats.

Phishing Email Training

If one of your employees receives an email asking for private company or customer information, would they send it out, putting your company and clients at risk? This service from Infotech Solutions, LLC is designed to find out, and help train your employees what to look for.

SERVSAFE® FOOD SERVICE TRAINING

We have been providing state required foodservice training for 26 years. SDRA offers live instructor-led classes for both the eight-hour National Certification and the four-hour State Recertification training. The coursework for both of these options is also available online. SDRA members receive discounts on the training.

IN 2022:

1,036 people attended one of our eight-hour and four-hour food service classes

42 classes were held in Aberdeen, Pierre, Rapid City, Sioux Falls and Watertown

38 online ServSafe® exams were proctored by SDRA

Employees also have the option to use an online remote proctoring option that allows them to take the exam at a computer at the business or home.

FAST-PACED FUN!

In 2022, the South Dakota Best Bagger Competition came back for a strong second year. Kicking things off in February, our 2021 champion Natasha Artz of Fair City Foods in Huron traveled to Las Vegas to compete in the National Best Bagger Competition (pictured left above).

Then, at the South Dakota State Fair in September, 8 skilled grocery baggers from accross the state competed to take the title of South Dakota's Best Bagger.

Elijah Schipper of Fareway Foods in Harrisburg took the top prize (pictured left below). He received \$200 cash and an expenses-paid trip to compete at the National Grocers Association's National Competition in Las Vegas, NV this February for a chance to win \$10,000.

Mary Peters from Buche Foods in Wagner took home second place and \$150, and defending champion Natasha Artz was awarded \$100 and third place.

WIDENING YOUR WORKFORCE

This year, we awarded over 60 checks to out-of-state workers who moved to South Dakota via our \$1,000 Workforce Incentive Program. Each year, SDRA presents the Retailer of the Year Award to recognize a business or business owner who is committed to excellence while making a difference in their community.

Launched out of Uthe's garage in late 2003, Trav's Outfitter soon opened a small store and began operating a boot truck that provides onsite sales of work boots at manufacturing facilities. The business continued to grow, leading to construction of a 28,000 square foot store in July 2018. A staff of 40 sells apparel and footwear for the working person, as well as hunting, athletic and motorcycle clothing and footwear.

The focus on quality products, personalized customer service and honesty has brought a loyal following. The award recognizes a restaurant that has earned a reputation for excellence with its food, service, and atmosphere.

The late Myril Arch developed a loyal fan base when he opened the restaurant on his ranch east of Pierre in 1986. Using his personal recipes for prime rib and sirloin, he emphasized the key was to properly age, cut and prepare the beef.

Myril's daughter Cindy Arch carried on the tradition when she took over the restaurant in 1994. She has expanded the restaurant to accommodate regular overflow crowds, but has maintained the standards and atmosphere her dad created – including sawdust on the floor. The SDRA Community Service Award recognizes a business that goes above and beyond to give back to the citizens of its community.

When a tornado destroyed the 41st
Street Pizza Ranch in September
2019, the owners knew they would
be closed for an extended period. A
good insurance package meant they
could continue paying their staff of 105
during the rebuild. Wanting to keep the
team engaged during the downtime, the
owners decided to boost their volunteer
efforts in the community.

"We took a bad situation of being closed and said we're not going to be able to see each other, but let's get together once a month and do something for the community," said co-owner Todd Pharis.
